THE RATINGS::: This is the sixth set of CCIR RANKINGS for the 2016 Season. This was the end of the regular season except for a few conference meets \& maybe a last chance or 2 . There was not a large number of iinvitationals last week as most teams were running conference meets or taking the week off to rest for Saturday's Regional Meet. There were not many changes in the rankings as there was little competition to cause changes.

Some real interesting Final Meets are shaping up. Consider D1/girls, the 3 rated teams, Seaholm, Northville \& Pioneer have all ran against each other 3 or 4 times and each time there was a completely different order to the finish of the 3 teams. Rankings are based on invitational results only! Ask meet managers to get us the results. We need to have results my Monday in order to make that week's issue. We have had good support from meet managers getting us the results. If you do not see a meet listed here please send us the results.
Teams are awarded points according to how they finish in the invitationals they run in, 10 points for first, 9 for second and so on. Some invitationals are weighted because of the large field and there is a minimum number of teams required in order for a team to earn rating points. The numbers in parentheses indicates the first place coach's votes/first place(s) in invitational meets. The final number is the total number of points for the school, including verse city crcoach's votes and invitational points. The invitational points are cumulative over the entire season, to a maximum of eight, with only one being counted each week. If a school has more that the maximum number for that week of the season, they will only receive the invitational points for the maximum allowed for that week. Total number of invitational wins will be indicated in the parenthesis. Coaches vote each week.
We distribute the rankings each week. If your local paper would like to receive them, send us a name \& email and we will include them on our list. The rankings are distributed each Tuesday evening. We are late in the evening this week.
